Draft Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council held on 19th March 2018 at Sawdon Village Hall commencing at 7.30pm

Present, Mr R Carey (Vice Chairman), Cllr Mrs M.K. Stockill, , Cllr Mr S Willbourne, Cllr Mrs Cllr J Gray, Cllr Mr M Evans, Cllr Mr D Landi, E. Steele (Clerk), 3 parishioners.

Apologies for absence: Cllr S Triffitt (Chairman), Cllr David Jeffels,

1 The Vice chairman opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. He said that the Chairman was unable to attend the meeting and sent his apologies

2 Absence – as above

3 Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on 19th February 2018, had a spelling error Item 15, this was amended then the minutes were accepted as a true and accurate record and signed by the Chairman.

4. Matters arising - Cllr Carey asked Cllr Evans if the play area could be located at the Cricket field. Cllr Evans considered it to be too dangerous and therefore not suitable. The Anne Smith Charity fund holds £1472.00. Cllr Carey has spoken to Louise Murphy regarding the Drains at Brompton. She was promised the drains would be done by the end of February, Cllr Carey advised Louise Murphy that the PC have contacted Highways. Louise Murphy said she would also contact highways and inform the PC on the update.

6 Police report- There has been one report, 16th February of threats and slander by extended family out of area at Sawdon.

7 Report by Borough/County Councillor(s). –

NYCC Highways have had 80 gritting Lorries working round the clock on the county's 6,000 miles of roads during the recent severe weather, together with 111 farmer-contractors who have played a big part in helping to keep roads open. Social services staff have had 4 x 4 vehicles to enable them to reach vulnerable older people in remote areas.

NYCC has increased its council tax by 4.99 which includes 2 pc which is ring fenced for social care (£60 pa on an average Band d property), while Scarborough BC has increased its rate by 2.99 pc (£5 on an average Band D property). The council is getting £3.2m in extra funding from the Government's Rural Services Grant. The council is receiving much needed additional funding which is being ring-fenced for

social care for the elderly and vulnerable people. SBC is expected to provide an extra £70,000 to improve grass cutting, and £50,000 is being earmarked for community projects.

Cllr Jeffels is pleased to advise Parish Councillors that in addition to the £5000 Locality Budget which starts again in May, a further £5,000 is being allocated to councillors for environmental work which can include highway improvements. He is proposing to use some of it to upgrade roadside footpaths on the A170. Cllr Jeffels would be pleased to receive idea for either funding grant schemes from Parish Councils whether it be for their own initiatives or other projects in the villages which they feel would benefit communities. Scarborough BC has agreed to ban sky lanterns from its land because of the danger to livestock in rural areas, and problems at sea where lanterns in some areas have been mistaken for May Day flares from boats in distress. Scarborough BC has agreed to earmark an additional £70,000 for grass cutting in the Borough, and a £50,000 fund has been agreed for community projects. Bus Services - Service 128 - despite some local fears, this service is continuing, Service 8 - This service is due to close in my April because of lack of support. Scarborough Cliffs Scheme - Work is progressing on the £15.9m scheme to stabilise the cliffs behind Scarborough Spa, and to protect 380 properties in the vicinity of The Esplanade. It is hoped that on-site work will begin in the spring. A new effort is being made to protect fragile eco-systems on the North York Moors by improving water quality. The waterways are home to rare species including fresh water pearl mussel, water vole and otters. Congratulations are due to Brompton by Sawdon PC for it initiatives in encouraging the presence of water voles in the parish - an excellent community project which will by much appreciated by children and probably encourage them to read "Wind in the Willows"!

NYCC will fund Village Hall signs on the A170. Cllr Jeffels has suggested that the existing metal pole outside the Post office Tavern be utilised.

Cllr Heather Phillips said that Mr Richard Marr from highways had attended the YLCA meeting, after a number of complaints had been received regarding Mr Marr, the matter has been taken further. The council tax has now been set and is to increase. Cllr Heather Phillips would like more information on the History project at Brompton- Cllr Phillips to speak to Di Ford. Cllr Carey asked if there are any planning enforcement officers at the Borough Council as he has received more complaints regarding the Cayley Arms, Cllr Phillips advised that she will be more involved in planning in May and is following this up.

8 Open Forum

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Dr Kay mentioned Woodgate way and that the name change was due to a mistake by Scarborough Council. The Clerk is to write to residents on Woodgate Way.

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(2) Update on the Councils current financial position - The Clerk updated the Council on its current financial situation. It had a total of £26,435.92p in the bank at the end of February 2018 and £4810.17p in the business saver account. A grant of £376.58 has been received from NYMNP for the Spinny. The Vat claimed back is £1325.17

a.) To agree laptop, software and antivirus protection – agreed clerk to place order with Currys Business. This will be funded by the transparency fund at a cost of £408.98p

12 Brompton and Sawdon Village Halls

Brompton Village Hall. – The village Hall are waiting for the plumbers to finish fixing the burst water pipes. The committee are waiting for a quote for frost stat controls in the toilets.

Sawdon Village Hall - There is a new mother and toddler weekly event to be held starting April. The village hall is having the Wifi installed. The Heritage weekend is to be held 22nd & 23rd September, 29th September is the Conservation Event organised by Alison Tubbs. 10th November Poppy Concert.

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Cllr Carey attended the YLCA meeting, they advised that the GDPR would make a big impact on some councils and that they are trying to get some exceptions for smaller councils. Highways explained that a highway path only has to be single file.

14 The Butts, Brompton -

There has been a flood down at the Butts with Sewerage water for 6 days. Yorkshire water attended 3 times before it was cleared. The water had started to go into the stream on Acres Lane. Di Ford had seen a family paddling in the flooded area and advised them that the water was contaminated it was discussed that maybe signs should be put up if this occurs again. Wold Ecology will be coming to do the report in April to check acres stream, vegetation and trees and check for water voles.

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a.) Email from Came and Company regarding pebble pond. Came and Company confirmed that the PC will be covered by the insurance. A grant has been applied for from NYMNP for the pebble pond and an information board. The bushes have been planted and the land marked ready for cultivation. Richard Baines suggested an information board for the spinny as a bench mark for the turtle doves. Cllr Willbourne asked Cllr Stockill if the Yorkshire Coast & Ryedale Disability Group have been to the site. She explained that they have advised that there must be no steep gradients or steps and a hard surface must be put down.

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- c.) Email Received – Jane Willbourne, Sawdon Village Hall Committee events checklist – Agreed.
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Cllr Stockill asked if the grass cutting around the dew pond was included with the regular cutting or if was taken from the caretaker grant fund. The clerk advised it was taken from the funding but it was agreed by the council that this will be included in the 10 cuts. Clerk to advise Harrisons.
